Frame construction, wood siding

Gable roof, composition shingles

Double-hung wood and aluminum windows, decorative shutters

Double door primary entrance on front, facing south toward Grove St.

Single door entrance on east end with Craftsman-influenced double gable

Gable roof porch on front (south elevation) with wood supports on brick piers and spindlework

Gable roof porch on east side with wood posts

Center passage, rectangular plan

Pier and beam foundation, brick skirting

One story, 1,536 square feet

Additions to west side and rear

Large corner lot, terracing, gardens, well/cistern, wood picket fence with brick supports
